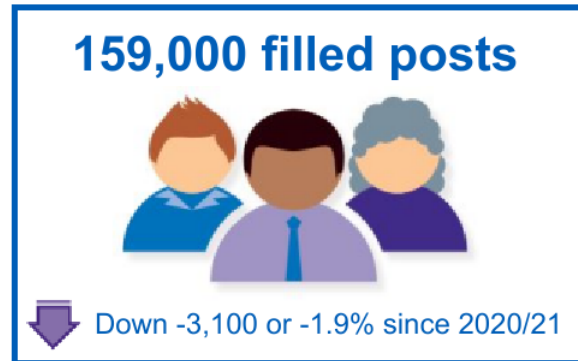
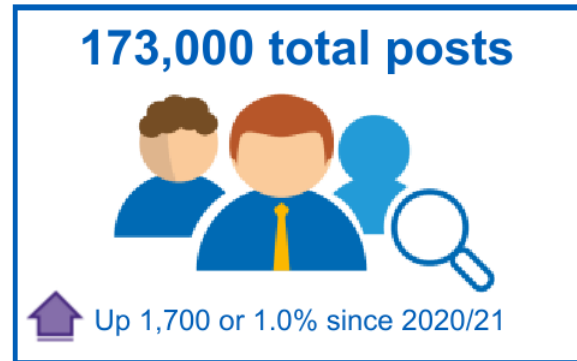

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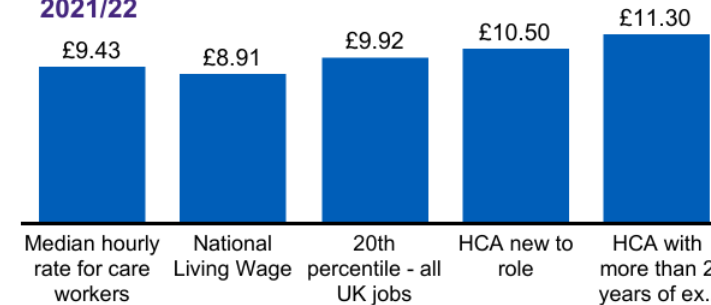
In adult social care in Yorkshire and the Humber, as at 2021/22, there were:

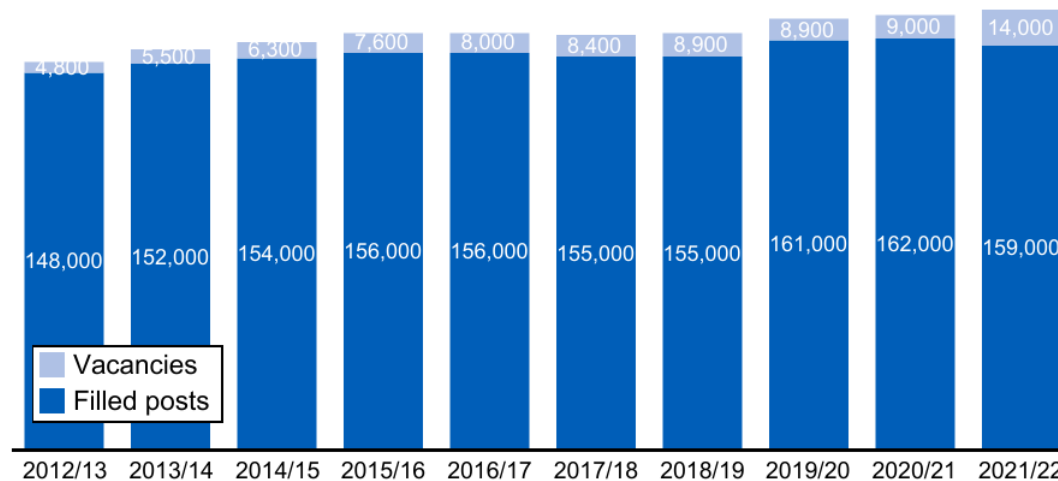


The total number of posts in the region has increased by 1.0% in 2021/22. However, fewer posts were filled, and more were vacant highlighting recruitment and retention difficulties and not a decrease in demand for social care staff.

### Median care worker pay compared to other job roles 2021/22

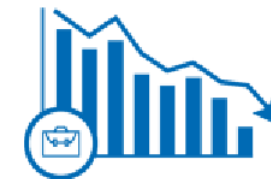


### Filled posts and vacancies between 2012/13 and 2021/22
